• Pettit reported Tyler Eide is remodeling a house on State Highway 43

ROADS/WATER/SEWER:

•Roads/Utilities Update-Chiglo:

 Chiglo was not at the meeting but sent an email to Miner with updates. Rip rap should be available this week or next week for County Line Rd. After County Line Rd he will be working on the bank erosion on Gilbertson Rd. When Gilbertson is completed he will be working on locating the gas line to Airport Rd ditch work done this fall

•County Line Rd Farm Equipment Traffic:

- A local farmer stopped at the CRV office to inform CRV they had purchased land at the top of County Line Rd. He read in the newspaper about work that will be taking place on a section of County Line Rd and wanted to know when this work would be taking place and if he would be able to use the road to for hauling his crops.
- Chiglo has been hauling fill to the area and plans to place rip rap soon. Any work being done on the bluff side to widen the road would have to stay within the CRV road right of way
- Council stressed safety is the main concern. Cones and signs need to be placed along the section of road where work will be taking place.
- The farmer did say they could go to Highway 43 but it would be longer for them
- Miner will let Chiglo know he is to contact this person to discuss the safe use of the road and to let the farmer know when the road will be worked on. Chiglo is to get cones and signs up ASAP

Wastewater License:

Knutson is looking into when and where Chiglo can take his wastewater licensing test. Knutson recommends
 Chiglo take the test that is one step above the one needed for lift station only operations

OTHER:

•ARPA-Furnace & Air Conditioner Estimates:

 Council reviewed the three estimates received from local contractors and feel all would be good to work with and all would provide good customer service

- All contractors were asked to give an estimate on furnaced and AC units based on current equipment.
- A person with knowledge of furnace and AC units was asked to look at what CRV currently has and found the furnaces to be oversized and running hot. His recommendation was to reduce the size of furnaces to 60,000BTU and 80,000BTU and the AC should be 16 Seer 2 and 3 ton units. He recommended going with Carrier if pricing was comparable
- Miner will send and email to each contractor requesting another estimate for the best 60,000BTU (70,000 BTU if they do not have a 60,000BTU) and 80,000BTU furnaces and the best 16 Seer 2 and 3 ton AC units only. Other comments/questions to be included in email: WIFI thermostat is not necessary, does price include removal and disposal of old equipment and would there be any other costs for the project?

Motion made to table discussion until more information is available

Motion by Ebner, 2nd by Hart. Carried.

•CRV Hall Rental:

- Request for Hall rental with alcohol was received. Rental date October 15, 2022. Per rental agreement this
 has to be approved by CRV Council and the renter must supply a declaration page or cerificate of insurance of
 public liability insurance naming the City as additional insured
- Renter did supply an Evidence of Property Insurance showing personal liability coverage in the amount of \$300,000 for October 15, 2022 and lists Rushford Village City Hall as an additional interest
- Questions regarding the difference between personal liability coverage and public liability coverage (in CRV rental agreement) were discussed and if the rental agreement needed to be updated
- O'Koren suggested a Hold Harmless Agreement be drawn up. Hold Harmless Agreement would need to be signed by the renter before the rental

<u>Motion</u> made to approve the rental on October 15, 2022 providing the renter signs a Hold Harmless Agreement

Motion by Knutson, 2nd by Ruberg. Carried.

O'Koren will draw up the Hold Harmless Agreement

- Miner will contact the League of Minnesota Cities regarding what insurance coverage a City should have for a community center rental when alcohol is being served and to see if a hold harmless agreement is necessary.
- CRV does not allow the sale of alcohol during a rental
