Permit Status / Projects in Process / Inquiries

- Pettit reported permits are in the works are for Rick Ruberg to put concrete in a shed and Sam Stensgard to replace windows and shingles
- •Knutson questioned what happens when a house is demolished. Pettit stated a demolition permit is required which is sent to Fillmore County so it can take it off the tax rolls
- Pettit reported Fillmore County is considering changing their definition of a campground. The new definition will read: *Campground:* Any area, whether privately or publicly owned, used on a daily, nightly, or longer basis for the accommodation of two (2) or more tents, or recreational camping vehicles for compensation. Privately owned camping areas of up to four (4) sites without compensation do not fall under the campground definition. Five (5) or more sites, whether free of charge of for compensation, are considered a campground.

A public hearing is set for Thursday, October 21, 2021 @ 7:00 pm in Preston. If adopted by Fillmore County the CRV Campground definition would also need to be revised.

ROADS/WATER/SEWER:

•Roads/Utilities Update-Chiglo:

- Roads/Utilities Update-Chiglo reported:
 - Digital speed sign moved from Plummer St to Main St
 - Hydrant flushing has been completed
 - Road signs have been ordered
 - The watermain at Sherwood and State Highway 43 S will be relocated by Griffen Construction on Thursday October 21, 2021.

McCarthy Well Company Pump Inspection Reports:

- Chiglo reported he meet with McCarthy Well Company for an inspection and everything was good
- Council reviewed the inspection reports. Well/Pump #2, item #6-The resistance between line and ground received a fair rating, Chiglo will contact Norman's Electric to have this checked. Well/Pump #1, item #17-Knutson questioned why the check pumping rate of gallon per minute said good when there should be a number. McCarthy will be contacted to have the check pumping rate gallon per minute number put on the report.

Motion made to accept the 2021 McCarthy Pump Inspection Reports

- Griffen Construction will be lowering the watermain at Sherwood St and south side of State Highway 43 S
 Thursday, October 21, 2021. They will also be completing the project at Meadow Ave and State Highway 16 by placing rip rap at the end of the waterway
- Bolton & Menk will contact property owners effected by the watermain project

OTHER:

• South Rushford Park Development:

- Ebner suggested the Council consider selling a portion of the South Rushford Park area as a developable lot to better utilize the land. It was suggested the money could be used to upgrade the playground equipment for the park
- The area above the park, not owned by CRV, has potential for development making the area below, which is the CRV park, a potential water run off area or a road may be needed for a potential development
- No action was taken

•Northern Natural Gas Company-Tax Court Refunds:

- The CRV estimated portion of the refund for 2018 of \$458.92 and 2019 of \$502.50 will come out of the upcoming CRV tax settlement in October/November
