ROADS/WATER/SEWER:

- Roads/Utilities Update: Miner Reported
 - o The insulation, lumber and tin has been delivered
 - o The bathroom in the maintenance shed has been completed by STS Plumbing. The heating element in the new water heater was faulty, STS got a different one from MiEnergy
 - STS Plumbing will be coming soon to install an inline eyewash station in the maintenance shed
 - Norman's Electric wired the bathroom, including the water heater and installing a baseboard heater. The plan was
 to use a milk house heater but STS Plumbing would not turn the water on unless a baseboard heater was installed.
 The fuel tank inside switch and outside light were also wired.
 - o Tree trimming has been getting done
 - o Ebner reported Chiglo was out before the last winter weather and rocked the roads
 - The F450 windshield has been repaired
 - o The Freightliner is at Brown's for its yearly DOT inspection

OTHER:

- Presidential Nomination Primary Election Judges: Karen Thompson, Elizabeth Atkinson, Catherine Bakkum, Gordy Elliott, Bonnie Elliott, Judy Graham, Mary Miner:
 - o Online judge training has to be completed for the Presidential Nomination Primary Election and in person judge training will completed before the Primary Election in August

Motion made to approve the Presidential Nomination Primary Election judges as presented

- American Rescue Plan Act Funds \$10,938.08-Maint. Shed bathroom & eyewash station:
 - The maintenance shed bathroom completion and an eyewash station are excepted uses for the ARPA funds. The
 invoices from STS Plumbing and Norman's Electric to complete the bathroom and install the eyewash station can
 be paid with ARPA funds
 - o Both items are for the safety of CRV employees
 - Charles is looking for grant money for a generator. It makes it more difficult because CRV does not have its own fire or ambulance services. Ebner stated CRV is designated as an emergency operation center. In the future Ebner would like to visit with Peterson and Rushford to discuss in the event of an emergency CRV could use them for a backup or they could use CRV for a backup. Estimated cost for a CRV is \$35,000.00

<u>Motion</u> to approve the use of American Rescue Act Funds for the CRV maintenance shed bathroom and eyewash station

• Rebecca Charles-CEDA Monthly Report-Safe Routes to School Grant:

- o Reviewed yearly review which included items to be completed in 2024
- o Charles will provide CRV with hard copies of the final Trail Study completed by UW La Crosse students. Copies will be in the CRV office for residents to view
- o Continues to work on completing the CRV Comprehensive Plan. So far the data that has been entered from the surveys is 33 pages. The yearly report outlines what was done in 2023 and what will be completed in 2024
- CRV was chosen to receive a Safe Routes to School Design Assistance Grant. The grant will provide engineering services to help determine and plan routes along with what is needed for those routes. Charles has spoken to Rushford and they are in support of backing the CRV plan and working with CRV to connect routes with Rushford routes. When a plan is ready CRV and Rushford will work together to submit a joint application for the trail itself. Charles to the award letter last night and is waiting for the confirmation package which should include the approximate value of the grant. Information gathered during the UW La Crosse Trail Study will be used. CRV does not have to contribute anything towards this grant now but once a route has been determined CRV would need to provide funds to build the route. Charles will look for grants to help with the development of the route/routes.
